COMSEC MONITORING REPORT AUGUST 1967

- The following circuits were monitored during the reporting period:
 - a. RR Channels

1 - 5 Aug

11 - 15 Aug

18 - 21 Aug

b. 1 ATF Command Net

- c. 2 RAR Command Net 1 Aug
- d. 7 RAR Command Net 6-7 Aug (Op BALLARAT)
- e. 7 RAR Company Nets 6-12Aug "
- f. CA Unit (Line) 30-31Aug
- 2. A monitoring detachment was deployed with 7 RAR during Operation BALLARAT with the aim of assessing company nets. Due to range, terrain and the use of short antennae by the companies this task was unsuccessful and very little information was recorded. Two security breaches detected are shown in Annex A.
- 3. 7 RAR Comd Net One minor breach detected. See Annex A.
- 4. 2 RAR Comd Net No significant information recorded. However on two occassions helicoptor inter-communication conversations were transmitted over this net by callsign 90.
- 5. Radio Relay Channels This system continues to be a security hazard. Both operations BALLARAT and AINSLIE were compromised several days before they commenced. See Annex A.
- 6. <u>CA Unit</u> Telephone calls to and from this unit were monitored during the period 30 31 August. From the information recorded it was obvious that a major operation (AINSLIE) was pending and involved the construction of housing facilities and probably resettlement of a large number of civilians. See Annex A.
- 7. The use of indecent language is still prevalent on RR channels. No examples are given in this report. Circuit time is being used for unnecessary or unauthorised purposes such as idle chatter or the placing of race bets. Many conversations are for too long. These practices tend to deny the use of these circuits to legitimate users and in some instances reveal information of a confidential nature such as results of courts martial or medical disabilities.

Have a conference on with the Brigadier at 1400 hours today on the method of census that we're going to go on with --- to put me in the portrait as to what the Task Force requirement will be over and above what we will do from the point of view of locals --etc---

--- we got caught up in this bloody tentage for this operation

--- he was going to ring me back about some poles upright tops and bottoms. Are they coming? --- yes they're going up this afternoon. We ordered four trucks but it was not enough to get it all on --- etc ---

operation coming up and I've gotta get the stuff packed and ready by tomorrow afternoon.

These conversations clearly indicate the type of operation about to start.
